











FCC Programs (2007-2019) by Region





Number of Providers in Urban vs. Rural Counties 2007-2019






FCC provider decline 2014 to 2019 in districts with and without UPK

Research Challenges

- "Siloed" administrative data sets
- ► Missing and incomplete data
 - ► No license exempt data in the NYS data base
- Administrative data that are continuously updated (difficult to track patterns over time)
- Inconsistent data and policies across states (difficult to conduct cross-state comparisons)

Next Steps

- What can we learn about FCC "leavers" and "newbies"
 - Rates of leavers and newbies across different communities
- Continued tracking of FCC patterns post-COVID
