

## **CCDF Subsidies and Parent Employment Patterns**

### **Description**

This session examined recent research on the relationship between child care subsidies and maternal work outcomes in the low-wage labor market. Discussants commented on recent findings synthesized in *Parent Employment and the Use of Child Care Subsidies*, a new Review of Research prepared by Child Care & Early Education *Research Connections*, and shared additional findings from their own work. Discussion focused on what we as a research and policy community can learn from this important research, what questions we should be asking next, and how we should ask them.
